



"What We've Been Doing" Congregational Potluck and Search & Call Presentation Sunday, April 26, 2015

We put our heads together and prayed, brainstormed, and pondered what goals would produce a strong, vital congregation in the next five years. In the end, we took our cue from the Board members who agreed to put all of Carlock Christian Church's resources on the line, agreeing to a generous financial package for the new settled minister. In addition, the Board talked about changes coming. But what exact changes none of us know. The Board does know that we need to grow in numbers, be flexible, and open to new ideas. In addition, we agreed the most important goal for Carlock Christian Church is to tell the story of Jesus and invite others into a relationship with the Risen Christ.

Now that we had a focus, we asked, "What do we as a congregation need so that we are ready for an unknown new life with a new settled minister?" One of the words that kept staying around on our list was foundation. We have a pretty good foundation here at Carlock Christian Church. However, any church when it is asked to face an unknown future with possible changes needs to shore up that foundation. How do you do that?

- By asking Jesus to give me the courage to see myself as others see me, or as God sees me.
- And then setting out to grow and mature spiritually, which means each person courageously evaluates his/her behaviors and the motives behind the behaviors, and what's in my heart that lets my mouth say some of the words it says.
- If we find anything lacking, we change it by upgrading what we do and how we do it and what we say so that when we come together as a congregation we all come as our better selves making a stronger and more substantial foundation for Carlock Christian Church.

Here's another way to look at it:

- How can I remain an Easter person?
- What makes me slip from being an Easter person to a crucifixion person?
- What are the situations in which I feel myself slipping into a crucifixion person, fading out of the Light as I use unsavory actions and ungracious words from my mouth?
- How do I want to leave behind my crucifixion personality and move into the Easter Light and remain there as an Easter person with solid good motives.

We also talked about evangelism, transformation, spirituality, a meaningful relationship with Christ—all of which are based on personal experiences with Jesus. After deciding that a tipping point for a new minister would be his/her ability to share their personal spiritual experiences with Jesus, we decided the congregation needed to be able to do the same. We love Jesus, trust him, receive comfort from him as well as guidance, pray to him. We also need to talk easily about Jesus and what Jesus has done in our lives this week, just as we ask our little children during Children's Time in worship. From our children we learn that sometimes our experiences with Jesus during the week are profound, sometimes Jesus provides a need for that week, and sometimes we are thankful to Jesus for fun in our lives, like Emma's Barbie Dream House.

We truly want to be the Church who is a Light on the corner. We know what Light means to us. Light to a great number of the younger generations does not necessarily mean coming to Sunday morning worship and following a paper bulletin with organ music. Spirituality to them is feeling and doing. They ask themselves: Would I be better off on Sunday morning doing volunteer work, to be the hands of Jesus; Would I better experience Jesus doing mission work somewhere; Do I need to be more active in a worship service to feel Jesus? Do we need to think about programs for younger generations, such as, a Mother to Mother, or a babysitting program for an afternoon or evening, or AA meetings in the Fellowship Hall, or a week-night children's program or a divorce care program, etc. Are any of these programs, which are attractive to the younger generations, part of our unknown future? We don't know the answers to any of these questions. They will be answered with our new minister. We do know that we want to be the Church of Jesus Christ and that as we become aware of needs in the community we want to be the Light on the corner.
