Message from the Pastor

Dear Church,

A couple Easters ago, I had to preach at a sunrise service. As I thought back to that morning, all I could think was, "Thank goodness I don't have to do that this year!" Sunrise services can be a special tradition for those who enjoy them, but they are not for everybody. I am not usually a morning person, but when I am up at a pre-dawn hour what strikes me is the quiet. It is so quiet in the morning before everybody's day has started. Maybe that is why some people find it a good time to get work done. Something else I always like about those early morning hours is the sense of anticipation that I feel, because of the stillness and the quiet. A strange anticipation that something might be different when the sun comes up, and when I am already up, I feel prepared to take on that challenge.

As I reflected on this, I realized that is usually where we find ourselves on Easter morning, whether it's at sunrise or a little later. We are in anticipation of something new. We have been through the night, that period after Good Friday, when Christ died, and before Easter morning, when we will celebrate the resurrection of the Risen Lord. The morning can be a liminal time. In between the lingering sadness and melancholy of Good Friday and just on the edge of the triumph and celebration of the Resurrection. It is an opportunity to reflect on the momentousness of the resurrection. That's why we come to church on Easter morning.

In all this excitement, though, let's not forget about those who are not morning people. People who find it difficult to rise and meet the morning. Perhaps because they are physically unable. Or maybe they are depressed or grieving, and so they are emotionally unable. Maybe they worked a late shift at their second job and need more sleep. Whatever the reason sometimes the morning can be hard to face.

Luckily, we don't have to be morning people to be resurrection people. Because resurrection will find us even in our darkness, just as it found Mary Magdalene and the other women who came to Jesus' tomb that morning. They got up that morning and when to the tomb, they came with their grief, they came to carry out the tasks of mourning and that is where they found the stone rolled away, that is where they first heard the news that Jesus was risen again. So, they were able to bring the news to the Eleven, the disciples who had not come out that morning. So, whether you are not a morning person, or you are a person in mourning, the Resurrection will find you. That is the power of resurrection – its certainty. Like death, taxes, or a sunrise, resurrection will come. It will come to show us that neither death and taxes or violence and pain or anything else have the last word.
