Message from the Pastor

Dear Church,

One of the lectionary texts for this week is the well-known verse Psalm 23. This is, of course, the one that begins, "The Lord is my shepherd..." When I hear this text a couple things come immediately to mind. One of them is the British television series The Vicar of Dibley, which my parents and I would watch on PBS when I was growing up. An arrangement of this psalm, in hymn form, would play over the credits before and after each episode. The second thing that comes to mind when I think of Psalm 23 is funerals. I hear this Psalm read or recited most often when I am attending a funeral. It makes sense that this psalm is a staple of funeral services. It paints a lovely picture of God as shepherd, leading us, faithfully, through life and death and into an afterlife where we can finally find rest and peace in the house of the Lord.

It is a lovely image, and lovely words. So much so, that it seems a shame that this verse only gets brought out during funerals. I say this because, as much comfort as this psalm can offer us with its vision of "goodness and love following me all the days of my life" and an afterlife where we will "dwell in the house of the Lord forever" it also has a lot to say to us about our relationship with God in this life. Certainly, God is our Shepherd, guiding us and beckoning to us, but we are not simply being led to a peaceful resting place in "the great beyond." A shepherd is not just for herding, the other part of the shepherd's job is to go out and find the lost sheep. We need that kind of shepherd. Lost sheep that we are, we too often wander away and find ourselves in a thicket or in a ditch or confronted by a lion. These are situations we cannot avoid, but that is okay, because our shepherd, the God we know in and through Jesus Christ, does not just lead us to green pastures and quiet waters. Our shepherd is with us when we inevitably fall into a ditch, or get caught up in a thicket, and our shepherd stands with us against that lion.

Our shepherd God is ever present in our lives, but that is not the end of the blessing. Through Jesus we have been shown the way to be a shepherd, too. We can help others find quiet waters and green pastures, but we also know that we can be with them in the ditch or the thicket. So, this week I invite you to reflect on this psalm and reflect on how it has influenced your relationship with God. Then reflect on situations where you have, or could have, shown up in the world as shepherd.
