#### **Message from the Pastor**

Dear Church,

As some of you may have seen, the CDC released some <u>new guidelines</u> outlining safe activities for people who have been vaccinated. According to the CDC's new guidance, it has been judged safe for vaccinated individuals, wearing masks to attend a worship service does not have limits on capacity. Likewise, they have deemed it safe for vaccinated individuals, wearing a mask to sing "in a chorus" at church. So, what does that mean for worship at Carlock Christian Church. Well, for one thing the tape that has been blocking off certain rows in the sanctuary has been removed. People are free to sit wherever they would like in the sanctuary. As for singing, there will be an opportunity for hymn singing at the end of this week's service. It will be held until the end so that those who do not feel safe or comfortable with the singing indoors will be able to exit the sanctuary, and those who wish to, can remain and sing. **Masks will still be required throughout the service, and while you are in the church building. Remember, these activities have been deemed safe for vaccinated individuals, there is still risk for those not fully vaccinated. Please take that into account when making decisions about your health and safety.** 

As a church community, we wish to provide a worship experience that is meaningful and that provides people with the spiritual practices, rituals, and expressions of faith that make them feel closer to God. Part of that is providing a space for worship that is safe and healthy for all those who enter it, a space in which people can know that God and God's people care for their wellbeing, spiritual, physical, and otherwise. With that in mind, discussions among church leaders had begun, before this announcement by the CDC, about how to continue to safely "re-open" the church and get things back to "normal." Those discussions will continue. These latest steps are taken with the hope of continuing to ease us back into the swing of things in a safe way. Many of you have attended in person worship regularly throughout this pandemic, and I am grateful for your presence in worship, and your grace in dealing with this learning experience. Some of you stayed away during the thick of the pandemic, doing what you thought was best for your health and your family's health, and I am grateful for your steadfastness during this time, watching online worship and staying connected to the church anyway you could. You also showed much grace. Some of you have begun to return to church, and some are still being cautious. I respect those decisions and look forward to continuing to find ways of being church together during these trying times.

From what I know from talking to people, we seem to be doing well in regard to the number vaccinations that have been received in our congregation. However, in order to get a clearer picture, I will be sending out a survey dealing with vaccinations and comfort level with singing in church. Keep an eye out for that.

Things are beginning to "normalize," but COVID is still among us and vaccinations are still rolling out. So, please, stay vigilant. Wear your mask, wash your hands, social distance. And, at Carlock Christian Church we will continue to try and do our part by providing as safe a space as possible.
