Dear Church,

They say Mother's Day is one of the most well attended Sunday's of the year, probably number two after Easter. The rationale here is that mothers make their children go to church with them on Mother's Day. It remains to be seen how this translates as we come out of a pandemic, but I remain hopeful. Growing up, my father was a minister, so it fell to my mother to get us kids to church on a Sunday morning. If Mother's Day is the Sunday when moms have to drag their family to church, then by that standard, for us every Sunday was Mother's Day.

However, this cannot be everyone's story. Not everyone's mother was able to take them church. Some did not choose to, some were not physically able, some were not around anymore. Some were brought to church by people who were not their birth mother, but who served a similar role of care giver in their life. Speaking as a single, childless male, I observe that motherhood is difficult, and it is complicated. But isn't that the case with families and relationships? Our experiences are not the same. So, while it is appropriate to honor and celebrate mothers, we must remember that when Mother's Day roles around each year we are all commemorating something different. A different person, a different relationship, or the lack of those things.

So, if you find yourself in church this Sunday, wherever that is, I hope you are able to be with you mother, but whether that is possible or not, whether that is desirable to you or not, it is okay. If you are a mother, I hope you are able to spend time with children. Mother's Day may be one of the most popular Sunday's of the year, but it doesn't have to be commemorated just once a year. Every Sunday we come and are in the presence of a God that created us and cared for us, that nurtured us and watched us grow and discover the world, that protects us with their presence and makes sure our needs are met. The maternal presence cannot be overlooked during worship, weather you sit with you mom every Sunday or not. So, in that sense, isn't every Sunday Mother's Day?

Emergency Broadband Benefit Program

Starting on May 12th the Federal Communications Commission will open up registration for the Emergency Broadband Benefit Program, a program that will fund a \$50/month discount on internet services/associated equipment rentals and a one-time \$100 discount on a laptop/tablet/desktop computer. You can determine if you qualify here (at or below 135% of the national poverty line, had a substantial loss of income during the pandemic, etc.) and learn more about the program here.
