Message from the Pastor

Dear Church,

In Acts 2: 1-13 we read the story of Pentecost. We are told that when the Holy Spirit came upon the assembled believers, they began speaking different languages, that is, languages that were not their native tongue. Some could understand them, some could not, but they knew that all were speaking God's truth. Now, I don't know about you, but I took a foreign language when I was in school. I took French from 7th grade through my junior year of high school. Unfortunately, I cannot claim to speak it fluently now, if at all. It is hard work learning a new language and I cannot claim to have been the most engaged student. Most of the phrases that stuck with me would not be appropriate for me to repeat in this space. I got by, but mostly my friend and I would simply goof around. Over the years my French has faded, my friend, however, learned to speak the language well. That is because he spent time as a missionary to a French speaking country in the Caribbean. Before he could leave, he had to learn to be able to communicate with the people. So, he brushed up on his French.

Theologian and scholar Willie James Jennings points to the significance of the people speaking different languages on Pentecost being that the Spirit seeks to join and bring people together. However, he also affirms my feeling stated above, that to learn a language is hard, but not just because it is an unfamiliar process, but because to learn another language "requires submission to a people." It is a humbling experience, because it means learning the pronunciation, the meaning, and the context of another culture's words. It means giving of ourselves to the experience of "The Other" at the expense of our own point of view, perhaps even our own ego. Maybe that is why my friend learned French so easily the second time, because he submitted himself to the service of others. He desired connection.

Sadly, throughout history colonizers and military conquerors have gone into foreign lands and imposed their own language on a people as a way of controlling the population. If anything, this kind of forced compliance created barriers and harmed communication, even if people were now speaking the same language. As Jennings says, God "speaks people fluently," and the Holy Spirit was sent to us so that we might also, speak people fluently. To do that requires a desire for connection, placing our attention on the needs of others, and a willingness to submit to the Holy Spirit, the foreign language teacher that is constantly trying to teach us to be fluent in people.
