Message from the Pastor

Dear church.

Starting this Sunday, the church policy on mask wearing will be updated to be in line with the CDC's latest guidance. So, mask wearing in the church will be recommended for all. However, vaccinated individuals will no longer be required to wear masks in the church. Non-vaccinated individuals, or those with health issues that might make them immunocompromised, will still be asked to wear masks, especially in a larger group setting such as the sanctuary. Everyone is encouraged to use their best judgement and make the choice they feel is best for themselves, their friends, and their family. If, for you, that means continuing to wear a mask, please continue to do so.

This new guidance from the CDC, along with the expected statewide lifting of most restrictions on June 11th, in a way marks the end of one season of this pandemic. Some may feel that these developments signify that the pandemic is over, and that life is finally returning to normal. Perhaps this will prove to be true, but I think if we have learned one thing from this past 16 months it is that we just don't know what the future holds. We do, however, know what the present holds for us. It is a world where we can begin to go mask-less more often, and where we can begin returning to the events and activities and people that we have been missing. However, despite all this, we will be living in a world where the COVID-19 virus is still with us. As we are learning, vaccination rates have slowed at this point, and it appears that we are still a long way off from reaching herd immunity. Some experts believe that we will never get there. So, we will learn to live with the virus. Vaccination makes a far less risky proposition for some, but the virus remains.

Hopefully, what will also remain with us are the lessons we learned during this period of our history. We have learned the ways in which something so small as virus can turn the world upside down, but we also learned that small acts like wearing a mask or simply staying home more often can be a help to a society in crisis, it can even save lives. These sorts of ripple effects have served to remind us that we are not alone here, that our lives are entirely our own, they are part of a larger community of people, and a wider world. Of course, this has always been the case, since God put Adam here to care for the Earth, and created Eve to help Adam, and so that he would not be alone. So, the virus may stay with us, but so will be that reminder and that opportunity, to continually recommit to that work God gave us. To care for all creation. To make room for the presence of God, no matter how hectic the return to normal gets.

Emergency Broadband Benefit Program

Now open, the Federal Communications Commission will open up registration for the Emergency Broadband Benefit Program, a program that will fund a \$50/month discount on internet services/associated equipment rentals and a one-time \$100 discount on a laptop/tablet/desktop computer. You can determine if you qualify here (at or below 135% of the national poverty line, had a substantial loss of income during the pandemic, etc.) and learn more about the program here.
