## **Message from the Pastor**

Dear Church,

During a conversation this week I was reminded of the nature of our traditions. I was reminded that sometimes our traditions -like communion, the liturgy, the hymns we sing, etc.- complicate things, because they mean something different to each of us. Some cling tightly to tradition, while others fail to see the same importance. The door swings both ways, as some people find traditions less meaningful as they are repeated week after week, yet for other people that same repetition is what makes these traditions important and uplifting. A lot of time is spent in churches debating (sometimes arguing) about these traditions. Which ones to uphold, which ones to let go. Still, it is important to remember what exactly it is we are talking about when we talk about church traditions. What we are talking about when we talk about traditions is relationship, the way we are relating to God and to the world.

During my conversation this week I was reminded that some people find just as much connection with God when walking in the woods or when sitting quietly at home knitting or reading as they do when taking communion at church. So, on a personal level, it's all about our relationship with God and the ways we find to express and experience that all important relationship. So, then, you might be asking yourself, what is the importance of tradition, these rituals we undertake week after week. Well, they are just other ways to live out our experience with God. Ritual traditions can serve as touchstones or totems that regularly return our attention to the spiritual aspect of our lives.

However, when performed as a community, such traditions acknowledge the reality that our relationship with God necessarily means a relationship with each other, with God's family and creation. Take for example the ritual of the Lord's Table. This is the defining sacrament of our denomination, the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). The founders of the denomination, Thomas and Alexander Campbell, experienced other denominations where access to the sacrament of communion was withheld only for those who met certain criteria. So, when the Disciples movement began an open table became a central part of worship and a founding principal of the denomination. As a community we carry out this ritual in the site of God, to remember Christ's gift of love and sacrifice, and recognize these gifts of the Spirit in one another and our community.

During the pandemic we saw many of these traditions halted or carried out in a different manner, such as using whatever you had at home as a stand in for traditional communion elements. We were reminded of just how important our traditions were to us, but also how flexible we could be in finding ways to honor our relationship with God. Hopefully, we will look back on this time and remember that our traditions and rituals are not tasks we are required to carry out in order to gain God's approval, but rather, actions we take to bring our attention back to our relationship with God and with another as God's children. And in this world so wonderfully and lovingly made by God, there is no wrong place, bad time, or incorrect way to come before God.
