Message from the (Youth) Pastor

Pastor Zach has asked that I write this week's weekly update message and I thought I would tell you about one of the Seminary classes I took during my June intensives. The class was called "Disciples History and Polity II" and focused on our denomination, the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), its history, its structure, and the different organizations that are part of the general church or affiliated with it. We were graced with four guest speakers from several of these organizations who spoke about their ministries and experiences.

Our first speaker was Laura Jean with the <u>Disciples LGBTQ+ Alliance</u>. The Disciples LGBTQ+ Alliance works on expanding the table of Christ by providing resources to congregations for having conversations about sexual orientation and gender identity opposed to being an outside force who dictates to churches. She spoke about the history of queer Disciples as well as toolkits and other resources they put together. She emphasized a point that was important not just for her organization, but for church in general, "Change happens through encounter and relationship." People don't change or grow together from being yelled at or talked down to, but through committing to be in relationship with one another through the good and the bad.

Our second speaker was Rev. Dr. Don Gillet, the incoming regional minister in Kentucky and former president of the National Convocation. The National Convocation serves as a voice within the General Church promoting pertinent issues related to the African American Church, carrying out the biblical mandate, and transforming lives. Rev. Dr. Gillet talked to us about how predominantly African American churches have existed since the beginning of our denomination in the 1830s in free states and spoke through the history of how the National Convocation came to be where it is today. While a long history, the brief is that the National Convocation is intended to cease to exist as per the legally binding merger agreement with the rest of the church from the 1960s that formed the denomination; we are still on that journey today, still seeking to be One Church.

Our third speaker was Rev. Chung Seong Kim, current executive pastor of NAPAD. NAPAD is the part of the Disciples that seeks to recognize and promote the gifts and presence of North American Pacific/Asian Disciples in the life and work of the Church. He spoke about how there are currently over 130 NAPAD congregations composed of 18 different languages and cultural groups; in addition, they are one of the fastest growing groups in the Disciples, adding new congregations every year! Another important point he spoke about was Anti-Asian violence and how it affects our NAPAD congregations, as well as noting that only 12% is reported.

Our final speaker was Rev. Dean Phelps, most recently the interim regional minister in Kentucky who spoke about Regional Ministry in the Disciples. He told us he defines the purpose of a region (for us the Christian Church in Illinois and Wisconsin) as building up ministry among the clergy (pastors) and congregations within their geography as well as cultivating connections. He additionally made the point that while we often might want to emphasize that our churches are autonomous, this isn't actually spoken of in our founding documents. Instead, he suggests we view our relationship with other Disciples' churches the way one of our founders, Alexander Campbell did near the end of his life, "Nothing I have said [about the Christian Church

(Disciples of Christ)] was meant to suggest that we were supposed to go it alone". As we support one another within churches, he suggests we think about how churches within our denomination can support one another as well.

While this is a lot of information, I hope you find some of it informative about the denomination our church has proudly been a part of for nearly 185 years.
