### **Message from the Pastor**

Dear Church,

A relative of mine is preparing to move from Indiana to California, to be closer to her son and grandson. So, this past week I was enlisted to help in the moving process. As part of the move, she will be downsizing from a house to something smaller. This necessitated getting rid of a lot of furniture. So, we took a U-Haul out to Indiana and loaded it full of furniture. Some of the furniture was pieces we thought could be used by someone else, things like a sofa, some bookshelves, etc. However, most of it was antique furniture, things that had been in the family for many years, things my mom wanted to keep for sentimental reasons.

Some of this furniture is in better condition than other pieces. Some seem to have a clear purpose, I can see what they might be used for, while other pieces I can't quite see where it will fit. Some of it will go home with someone, while some it may stay in a storage locker somewhere for an undisclosed amount of time. These are the sorts of decisions that we all weigh as we move, geographically, as well as metaphorically, through life. What to take with us, what we can afford to leave behind, and what we want to be unencumbered from. We all have those things, those possessions or ideas or relationships or traditions that we cling to like a piece of furniture that has become a family heirloom.

The upcoming occasion of Carlock Christian Church's 185<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration gives us all an opportunity to reflect on the memories and traditions -those heirlooms- that we cherish from this church and our individual relationships with it. It will be a time of remembrance and celebration to be cherished and honored. However, taking a look back at where we have been also provides for us a good opportunity to look ahead at where we might want to go. It is good to appreciate our heirlooms, but it is also goo to look at what they are being used for now, what they might be used for in the future. How we incorporate these things into future plans is an important consideration.

So, to help guide into thinking about these things, I will be preparing two (2) sermon series for the coming months. One will lead us into our September 12<sup>th</sup>, 185<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration, and the second will lead us out in the weeks that follow. Starting August 15<sup>th</sup> I will offer the Disciples Heritage sermon series, in which I will be reflecting on Carlock's heritage as a part of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), what that means for our life and history as a congregation, and how it can guide us in our lives. The second sermon series, starting September 19<sup>th</sup>, will be "Enter to Worship, Depart to Serve," where we will consider the words of the slogan printed on our bulletins. What do worship and service mean for our life as a congregation and how can we continue to live into that slogan going forward.
