## **Message from the Pastor**

Dear Church,

I am writing today to share some news with you. Some of you may have heard this already, especially if you were in attendance on Sunday morning.

The update is that I am resigning as Pastor of Carlock Christian Church, wrapping up my ministry in the coming weeks. This decision was not made lightly by any of us involved.

Below you will find my official letter of resignation, which details the decision a bit more. Peace and health to you all.

This past year has been one of much change and uncertainty. It has affected all of us in different ways, and we will all have to respond to it in the way that we feel is best. The future seems more uncertain than usual. So, with that in mind, while I am grateful to have been able to be in ministry and relationship with the congregation of Carlock Christian Church during this past year, I believe we have reached a point where change is needed for all parties concerned. The Pastoral Relations Committee agrees, and we believe the church will need a leader that can guide it into the future who has a vision for what this community of faith can be, and a passion for the work of congregational ministry in a rural setting. At this time, I can no longer offer these qualities, and believe I am being called to pursue different opportunities and expressions of ministry. So, I am hereby resigning my position as Pastor of Carlock Christian Church, with an anticipated final date of Sunday, September 19<sup>th</sup>.

I thank the congregation for the opportunity to serve, and for being a supportive part of pastoral formation, and wish you all nothing but blessings on your future ministry.
