### **Message from the (Youth) Pastor**

Dear Church,

With Pastor Zach out of the office this week, he asked me to write the Weekly Update article. This week I thought I would write about gardening, or at least my experience with it. Up until this year, I thought I had inherited my gardening abilities from my mother which could be summed up in the phrase she repeated in my childhood "I have a brown thumb". Opposed to the common "green thumb", our attempts at gardening while I was growing up were met with withered plants that quickly died off to brown stalks and leaves.

This year Alix asked for a raised bed garden, and I constructed it from some old planks in our garage and moved many wheelbarrows full of soil from other parts of our yard to fill it up. Once complete, Alix and her dad planted peas and, in my attempts to procrastinate from school and work, I took on watering responsibilities. Within a week there were sprouts! I weeded away everything else and became excited about gardening, so I planted radishes and carrots as well.

Another few weeks went by, and the radishes and carrots were coming up and looking just like I expected, but the peas really were not growing. I decided to download an app on my phone that let me take a picture of a plant and identify it as I began having doubts about my pea sprouts. Much to my shock, the app identified my pea sprouts as... Common Crabgrass!

As I reflect on this experience of cultivating common crabgrass, watering it, and weeding away its competition, I can't help but be grateful for the experience. If it were not for the crabgrass I was caring for, I wouldn't have become excited about gardening and planted the radishes and carrots, much less taken care of the cucumbers, squash and zucchini that came up later. Having just had a tasty lunch of cooked carrots from the garden while writing this, it would have been a loss!

Often our faith journeys can be like my mistrials in gardening. We make mistakes, we hit dead ends, and we don't end up with what we thought we had planted. Thankfully our God is the God of forgiveness who loves without limits. No matter the mistakes or dead ends that our faith may seem to take, these accidental cultivations of crabgrass serve to keep us on the journey with a God who promises a bountiful harvest ahead.
