Message from the Pastor

Dear Church,

This past weekend I was in Lincoln, NE to perform my sister's wedding. It was a beautiful, meaningful service (and I'm not just saying that because I officiated) and it was a wonderful week spent with family – old and new. I thank you all for allowing me the time to make that trip, and I thank Pastor Clayton for filling in so capably in my absence.

What I want to share with you all now is an excerpt from the wedding ceremony. These words were mostly written by my father, and I delivered them as my sister and her husband planted an olive branch in a pot of dirt (my sister pouring in dirt from her family home in Decatur, IL and her husband pouring in dirt collected from where he grew up in Nebraska). Before they did this, I said:

The dove brough an olive branch to Noah on the ark as an indication that there was new life beyond the chaos of the flood. In the continuing story of God's people on this earth, a dove carrying an olive branch has become the symbol of peace among people in the world.

As a symbol of their union, Avery and Mitchell will now plant a piece of an olive tree. They will prepare the earth and plant and water the seeds. They do this together as a symbol of their intention to live creative lives in peace with each other and their community. They will now plant this symbol of unity in the rich soil of their individual, earthly homes.

As I said, most of these words were written by my father, edited by me for the service, but I think they can be meaningful for us in Carlock as we approach the celebration of 185 years of ministry. Because 185 years ago something was planted here in Carlock. A church and a community of faith that like the dove of peace continues to this day to be evidence of God's continuing story of love and salvation. Also, like that olive branch that was planted to represent the bond of marriage, the church that was planted and still exists here, represents a covenant made between God and the church and the church and its members, as a commitment to live creative lives in peace with each other and the community.
